Directions:

Drive north on I-15 north from Great Falls, 22 miles to the Power, MT. exit. For those driving from Missoula, at Vaughn, MT. drive north on I-15, 12 miles to the Power exit! Turn right at exit, road will turn to gravel, drive 2.8 miles east to 18th Ln. NE, turn left on 18th Ln. NE, drive 7/10 of a mile to north, turn right on track to flying site. Look for cars and trucks at site! You have arrived!
