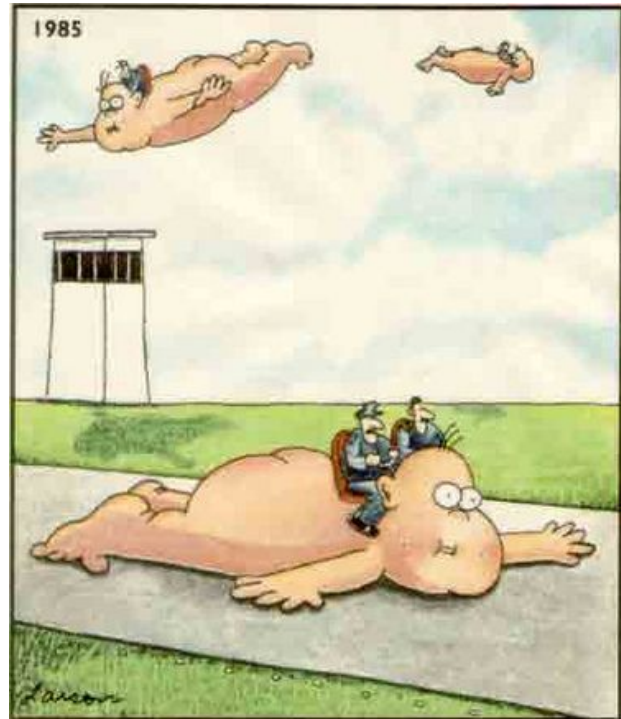
We flew 8 combat rounds during the day with seven pilots competing.
