Fence Pro came in and put in new chain link fence and gates for our safety fence in place of our orange snow fence. The chain link looks so awesome, really dresses up the place.

Field Safety

Larry Nelson, our Safety Officer, requested that I print a copy of our club's safety code. Since it's the beginning of another flying season for us, it's a good time to revisit, reiterate, etc., our club's and the AMA's rules regarding safe flying practices. Please review the Safety Code printed below.

Gallatin Eagles Safety Code

- AMA membership is required to fly at the field.
- Your name and address or AMA number should be attached to each aircraft. (not required for indoor aircraft)
- An inexperienced pilot should be assisted by an experienced pilot.
- Area away from pits must be maintained for spectators.
- A spotter for First Person View (FPV) aircraft must be capable of taking over flying duties in case of an emergency.
- Flying over the pit area and vehicles is strictly forbidden.

- Never fly near full size aircraft.
- Observe noise limitations and flying times at the field.
- Engine starting should be performed in designated areas.
- Aircraft hand launched should be away from individuals and vehicles.
- Pilots will stand behind the pilot's safety barrier or 25 feet away from the south edge of the runway while flying and be clear of the runway.
- Please be aware of who is flying and what they are flying.
- Pilots should give notice of preparing to takeoff or land.
- Pilots must give notice of walking on or crossing the runway.

Large and Not So Large Aircraft

The aircraft we're standing in front of is a KC97G. It had four R4360 engines - 28 cylinders and about 3500 hp normally. We refueled B-47s when we were flying out of El Paso, Texas, and B-52s after we moved to Great Falls. I had about 700 hours in this aircraft. We could load the



jet fuel tanks with aviation gas for longer range. Wide open and loaded lightly, we could do almost 400 mph and the ceiling was about 28,000 ft.

The R/C plane is a Regulus (photo on next page) with an OS .40 in it. The radio is home built from articles in RCM and is called a Digitrio. A supplier called World Engines kitted the radio.

On another note, we now have one of the finest flying fields in Montana. All of this can be credited to Destry. He does know how to get things done. We will forever be grateful to him for what he has got done. gotten done? got did? Whatever. I've been around Larry too

long!

I have a wing building jig from Great Planes that is free to anyone that wants it. It uses steel rods through holes in the wing ribs to keep them aligned until the glues dries. It belonged to Ed Welch and his widow gave it to me for the club.

Just a reminder--I have lots of small parts such as quick links, hinges etc. Give me a call if you need something. 587 4934.

Adam Stamey has been an active member of our club for several years now. Thank you Adam for filling this position.


